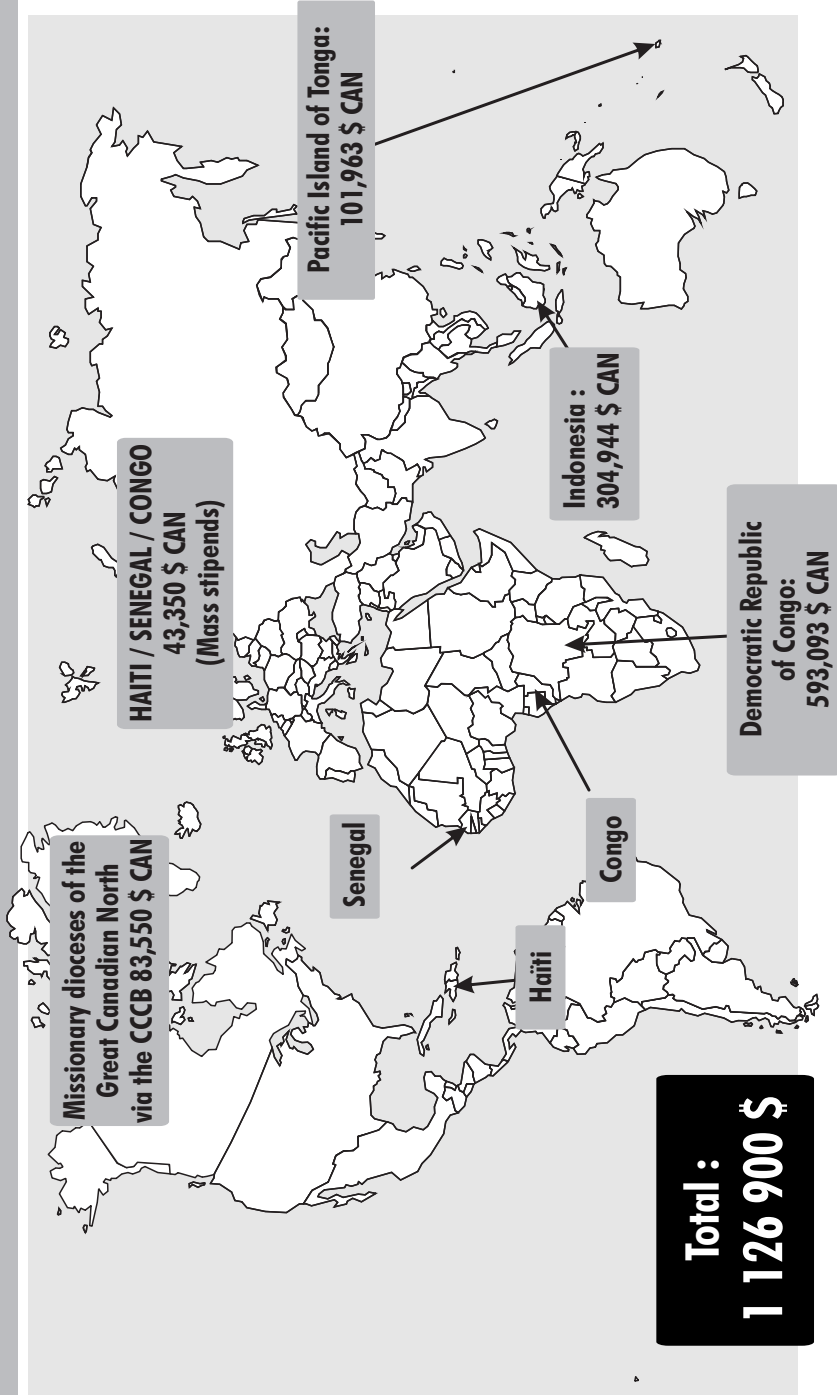


# YOUR DONATIONS GO TO THE POOREST CHURCHES OF THE WORLD.

### A universal collection

The collection on World Mission Sunday is an «inspired» universal collection. This means that all the Catholic communities of the world must remit the whole of the collection to the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith. All the donations collected in all churches of the world on that day make up the *Universal Solidarity Fund*.

### A liturgical sign

The collection which takes place during the Eucharistic celebration is a liturgical act and sign of solidarity and sharing. It represents the gift of ourselves and the fruit of our work, our union to the altar sacrifice and our participation to the mission of Christ through our solidarity with the poorest Churches of the world.

This collection cannot be replaced by a collection at the doors of the church neither by a remittance of what is collected as a surplus to the regular ordinary collection. We cannot also put into a common fund all the «compulsory» collections of the year and spread them out equitably between various projects of the parish, since that would amount to betray the intention of the one who wants to give for the Propagation of the Faith. Moreover, we cannot put aside a part of the collection for other causes more or less connected with the mission (for example: twin associations with a poor parish of the South, projects of a missionary in the parish, missionary congregations or institutes present in the parish, etc.), since only the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith has the right to take in the collection of Mission Sunday (Statutes PMS, art. 10). In many parishes where the envelopes are removed at the beginning of the year and this for all Sundays, would it not be good to think of bringing back an envelope for the collection of World Mission Sunday?

### A sign of fraternity and of solidarity

The universal collection of the World Mission Sunday is unique in itself: its fruits are distributed worldwide according to the needs of the poorest dioceses. Everybody participates in it and it allows that poor dioceses may

live, especially those who do not benefit from the twin associations or from privileged contacts with the West. It gives each bishop the means and the freedom of action for the formation of catechists, vocations, education, health care, etc. And so it is a tool to assure justice and fraternity between dioceses. Moreover, it aims at supporting the permanent effort of the universal Church to go and proclaim the Gospel to all nations. This mandate received from Christ is carried by all the baptized, co-responsible of the universal Mission with the Church in Africa, Asia, the Americas, Europe and Oceania.

## WORLD MISSION SUNDAY A UNIQUE COLLECTION

### Statutes of the PMS (Pontifical Mission Societies)

Vatican – Chapter 2, articles 7, 8 and 10

This day is celebrated in all the particular Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal solidarity. On this day Christians throughout the world become aware of their common responsibility for the evangelization of the world (Article 7).

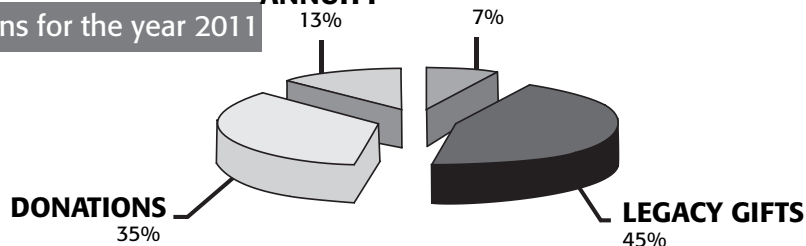
Bishops are invited to ask those responsible for Catholic organizations and the faithful to renounce to any other collection of a particular nature during that period (...) They should also ensure that offerings given on World Mission Day are used exclusively for the objectives of the Universal Solidarity Fund and encourage their priests and laity in that spirit (Article 8).

All the offerings collected by the Society constitute the Universal Solidarity Fund of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith (Article 10).

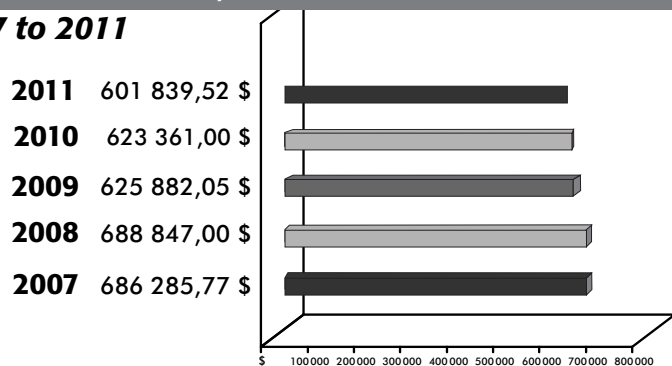
